VEHICLE SAFETY

The students who help with traffic in the morning and afternoon have some safety concerns and we would like to ask for your help to be sure no one is hurt. Please only pick up or drop off students at the curb, use the crosswalk when crossing the street, and please pull up as far as you can so students don't have to be dropped off or picked up around the bend.

PE NEWS

Fitness Flash: We spent class time talking about the muscle group that grows stronger when we do sit-ups (abdominals, or “abs” for short). See if your student remembers the name of this muscle group. We practiced two new exercises that strengthen the abdominal region—”let-downs” and v-sits. The Kindergarten class is performing another 30 second jump rope timing each day in PE this week, while grades 1 and 2 are taking a one-minute timing. The timing for Grades 3 through 8 has increased to 90 seconds for this week. Students are being encouraged to set a steady pace so they can continue jumping throughout the entire time period.

Lesson Focus: Grades K-2 are working on being able to perform movement sequences. The teacher rolls big foam dice across the floor and whichever numbers show, that is the number of repetitions the children perform of specific movements. Kindergarten worked on sequences of 2 movements, while 1st & 2nd performed sequences containing 3 movements. The upper grades continued their unit on Frisbees. They worked in twos, practicing new ways to throw, and then completed a short indoor Frisbee Golf course. Thursday, weather permitting, we will go outdoors and do a much larger course.

Volleyball Intramurals: We have had an outstanding turnout for volleyball this fall. 39 children signed up for the K-3 session and 23 for grades 4-8, a total of 62 participants. We have 18 children from the Kindergarten class—that’s by far the largest number from any single class! Thank you parents, for getting your children involved! **We are going to extend our volleyball season by 1 week, so next Wednesday, September 20th will be our last day of volleyball.** The next intramural sport will be flag football. Watch for permission slips for this sport to be available by the end of the week.
